Weekly Reading Tasks	Weekly Phonics Tasks
Monday- Read and watch the story "One Snowy Night" by Butterworth. We have attached a video of us reading the story or alternatively you can watch i on you tube <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vChCLsf6DEs</u>	
Talk with a grown up about how the weather has changed outside in Percy's Park and how this has affected the animals who live outside. Why are they knocking on his hut door? Have you seen any frost, hail, ice or snow this winter in your garden or whilst out exercising?	Look at <u>'Ruth Miskin Training'</u> on you tube: This has daily phonics lessons for Set 1 and Set 2 sounds (most children in Class 1 are currently working on Set 1 sounds, but some will be ready to start Set 2). The structure is similar to what the children are used to at school – so take a look, join in and have fun!
	We have attached a pdf of a Red Ditty story for you to read at home. Please read Ditty 3 "In the net", read the Green and Red words by sounding them out and blending the sounds together. Read the short 3 page story and then have a go at writing the Green and Red words. Now try a sentence together: "a log in the net". Remember to sound it out and use finger spaces and a full stop.
<b>Tuesday-</b> Ask your child to retell the "One Snowy Night" story, you may want to watch the story again. Can you retell the story in your own words, which characters knocked on the door, can you remember the correct order of the animals? What did Percy do and who was hiding under the floorboards? What noise did the Mole make under the floor boards? What happened at the end fo the story?	
	Look at <u>'Ruth Miskin Training'</u> on you tube: This has daily phonics lessons for Set 1 and Set 2 sounds (most children in Class 1 are currently working on Set 1 sounds, but some will be ready to start Set 2). The structure is similar to what the children are used to at school – so take a look, join in and have fun!
	We have attached a pdf of a Red Ditty story for you to read at home. Please read Ditty 3 "In the net" again, read the Green and Red words by sounding them out and blending the sounds together. Read the short 3 page story and then have a go at writing the Green and Red words. Now try a sentence together: "a fat fish in the net". Remember to sound it out and use finger spaces and a full stop.

## Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about 'Winter Changes'. Learning may focus on thinking about what is happening to the weather and what changes that we can see.

- Have a look at this Winter Powerpoint (PDF attached), talk about the changes to the weather and how this affects what we do at home and school.

- Can you make your own snowflake using these instructions <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JVy0OZ4Erjl</u>. You can make the snips as simple or as tricky as you like to create a snowflake shape.
- <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tpYnYczNkQc</u>. Listen to this beautiful, calm and gentle winter music played on the piano. As you listen, watch the winter scene pictures and think about how you could move your body in time with the rhythm of the music. Take some time to stretch and then relax as you listen. You may want to do some drawing or painting as you listen, I wonder what you would draw or paint? Create your own dance routine, you could perform it for your family. - Watch the video attached of Mrs Wykes introducing our new Jigsaw PSHE topic is 'Dreams and Goals'. In the video, Mrs Wykes will ask you to have a go at a challenge, e.g. to try to build a tall tower using spaghetti and marshmallows, or build a tower from cards, or sort a bowl of beads and sequins whilst blindfolded! How did you find that challenge? How did it make you feel? Think about how sometimes we come across things that are challenging and talk with your grown up about ways you could overcome them. What do you find tricky at the moment (it could be tying shoe laces, putting on a coat, learning to ride a bike, counting or learning new sounds)? What can you do to go to get better at it? Upload an observation on Tapestry showing you having a go at one of the challenges or having a go at something you find tricky at the moment.

## Mindfulness

Use this Winter Music <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tpYnYczNkQc</u>.

Have your child sit or lie down in a comfortable position with their eyes closed. They might like to use a snuggly blanket, a cuddle toy or a cushion so that they feel cosy, safe and relaxed. Ask them to close their eyes and stay still. All they need to do is listen to the music / sounds of nature. If any thoughts pop into their head, you can tell them that the thoughts are just like clouds and float away. Every time a thought comes along, just let it float away like a cloud and continue listening to the sounds. You can do this for 2 or 3 minutes every day, or for as long as your child feels able to focus.
