# Maths: Place value, adding and subtracting.

<u>Y3:</u> Multiplication and division with a focus on the 2 to 9 times tables.

<u>Y4:</u> Distributive law, 11 and 12 times tables, division with remainders, short division, area and perimeter.

### Launch Week

Pupils will explore the history of computers and the immense impact of the technological revolution. They will then participate in a series of computer coding lessons.



- Identify and describe functions of different parts of flowering plants.
- Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth.
- Investigate how water is transported within plants.

## The Environment

- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.
- Recognise that environments can change and this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

## Other curriculum areas (ART/DT/RE/ and PE)

- ART/DT: design a t-shirt with an ethical message.
- Computing design and write programmes designed for a specific purpose. Explore the impact of computers and digital the world of technology on modern life.
- Geography Identifying the Equator, Tropics, Arctic and Artic Circle. Examining and explaining vegetation belts, biomes, climate zone, and time zones. Comparing the human and physical geography of the U.K and Spain.
- RE: What is it like to follow God? Aspects of Muslim worship and festivals.
- PE: invasion games: hockey and football.

## Intended Outcome

Pupils will design a T-Shirt with an ethical message which will be printed by a local business and will be available to purchase. Profits from the T-Shirt sales will go to one charity decided upon by the whole class.
