


# Enquiry Question: What does it mean to be courageous?



## <u>Curriculum – Discover</u>

During this project, we will explore the difference between courage and bravery. As well as examining courageous figures from Ancient Greece and 18<sup>th</sup> century Cornwall, we will consider opportunities that exist within our own lives to overcome our own fears and overcome challenges.

## <u>Literacy</u>

<u>SPAG:</u> Punctuation, determiners, types of sentences, fronted adverbials, subordinating conjunctions.

### Writing units of work:

- Narratives based on Ancient Greek Quest Myths. We will read range of myths and then write our own quests in this style.
- Non-chronological reports about Ancient Greek gods.
- Persuasive writing based on Krindlekrax by Philip Ridley.
- Diary writing based on a Cornish miner emigrating.

## Rocks and Soils

- Compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.
- Recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

## Sound

- Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating.
- Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.
- Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it.
- find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.

## Other curriculum areas

- ART/ DT: ancient Greek patterns and pottery. Designing and making a Cornish Cream Tea.
- Computing online safety, creating an interactive quiz using Scratch.
- History: Ancient Greece, Cornish tin mining in the 18<sup>th</sup> century and the Cornish diaspora.
- RE: What do Christians learn from the creation story? How do festivals and family life show what is important to Jews.
- PSHE: JIGSAW Being me in my world. Celebrating Differences
- French: Greetings and names, numbers, age, animals, family.
- Music: Writing lyrics to fit a theme. Exploring pulse and rhythm.
- PE: Swimming and Netball.
- Computing: Interactive quizzes. Scratch: designing and debugging programmes.

### Intended Outcome

Pupils will have opportunities to explore lots of different examples of courage. The term will culminate with a showcase of pupils' writing at which they will serve a Cream Tea that they have designed and made.
