Attendance

As mentioned in previous Newsletters we have an obligation to make parents aware if there child's attendance drops below 95% as this is classed as Persistent Absence.

We will be monitoring all of our children's attendance next week as it is something that we do every half term.

If your child's attendance has dropped below the national school target of 95% we will send home a letter making you aware of this. We are aware that for some of the children their absence is due to illness and whilst this is classed as an authorised absence it does still affect their overall percentage. Please be assured we are not questioning why they have been absent from school, the first letter we send is purely to inform you that your child's attendance percentage has dropped below 95% and what it currently is.

Children who frequently miss school often fall behind. There is a strong link between good school attendance and achieving good results.

General Reminders

- The school office closes at 4pm, if you are collecting children from Allsorts please call their number on 07745 906649.
- A gentle reminder to all parents that children are **not** to play on the Trim-Trail at the end of the school day.
- Parking has become an issue again. To keep all children safe, please avoid parking on the zigzag lines at all times especially when dropping off or collecting students.
