<u>Curriculum – Discover</u>

During this project, we will explore why we consider some things to be art, while others not. We will examine a range of modern and historical, well-known and lesserknown artistic pieces from different cultures. We will produce our own pieces of art in various mediums and consider what we as humans gain from creating and viewing art.

Literacy

- Narrative writing based on "The Dot" by Peter Reynolds.
- Biography writing of a famous artist.
- Instruction writing linked to creating a piece of artwork.
- Discursive writing: Who killed Julius Caesar?
- Explanation: What is art?
- Spelling patterns, punctuation and grammar learning (SPaG) following the Year 3/4 curriculum objectives.
- Continued development of the children's reading skills, particularly in their understanding of a range of texts.

Maths: Place value, adding and subtracting.

Y3: Number – place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division

Initial discussion:

Art Detectives:

Chromatography experiments, exploring colour mixing, art treasure hunt, exploring an art timeline, what would you do with a dot?



States of Matter

- Compare and group materials together into solids, liquids and gasses.
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled and measure/research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
- Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle

Other curriculum areas:

- ART/ DT: exploring the works of various famous artists and different types of fine art. Creating individual pieces of art and work in personal sketch books.
- Computing: online safety, drawing and desktop publishing.
- History: the impact of the Roman invasion of Britain. Disciplinary knowledge: using artefacts to learn about Roman life and beliefs.
- Geography: weather and the water cycle.
- RE: What do Hindus believe God is like? What is the Trinity and why is it important for Christians?
- PSHE JIGSAW: Being me in my world. Celebrating Differences.
- Music: Charanga Music Scheme Mamma Mia.

Intended Outcome

Pupils will run an art exhibition at the end of the term to share and celebrate the art they have produced, studied and discussed.
