

Dear Parents/Carers

After schools shut their gates this Friday afternoon, they will remain closed until further notice, except for children whose parents are key workers and vulnerable children. This is part of the country's ongoing response to tackling the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19).

For the full list of keyworkers please visit http://www.aspireacademytrust.org/keyworkers. Many parents working in these sectors may be able to ensure their child is kept at home. Every child who can be safely cared for at home should be.

Daily school-based provision will also be offered to vulnerable children which includes those who have a social worker, are on the Child Protection Register and those with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCP).

Children who do **not** fall into these groups should remain at home with appropriate care.
