Summercourt Play Area

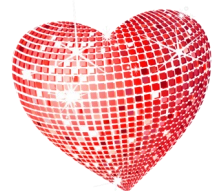

Rose Burfoot and Maisy Dawes' Top Spelling Strategies and Tips.

1. Split the word into different sounds. e.g. Apple A (for apple) pp (for pips) and le (sound you would make if it was rotten)

2. Make up mnemonics and near mnemonics for your spellings. These are silly rhymes and saying that are based on the letters that spell the word.

e.g. because - big, elephants, can, always, understand, small, elephants

island - I, sing, loudly, and, noisily, dance.

does = do, elephants, swim

3. Write your spellings using a different colour for each letter. E.g people

4. Draw a picture to go with your spelling to help you remember it.

5. Write your spelling down to create steps

e.g. home h

ho

hom

home

6. Create flashcards with tricky spelling on them.

7. Display tricky spellings on flashcards around your house - on the fridge, on your bedroom wall, on the back of the toilet door!

8. Use your favourite gel pens and highlighters to write your spellings. You can use fancy letters and bubble writing!

9. Make up a silly song about your spelling.

10. If you have time, make cookies and ice the tricky word on top. Bonus - you get to eat the cookie afterwards.
